#### **Objectives and principal activities**

The charity's purpose is the relief of poverty or economic hardship, advancement of religion, advancement of community welfare including the relief of those in need by reason of youth, age, ill-health, or disability, the advancement of community development, including rural or urban regeneration, promotion of civic responsibility or voluntary work, promotion of health, including the prevention or relief of sickness, disease or human suffering and the advancement of conflict resolution or reconciliation, promotion of religious or racial harmony and harmonious community relations.

The Aim of the Society is the advancement of the Christian religion in the sphere of marriage and family life. In order to carry out this aim, its objectives are:

-To uphold Christ's teaching on the nature of marriage and promote its wider understanding.

-To encourage parents to bring up their children in the faith and life of the Church.

- -To maintain a worldwide fellowship of Christians united in prayer, worship and service.
- -To promote conditions in society favourable to stable family life and the protection of children.
- -To help those whose family life has met with adversity.

'Away from It All' holidays provided to enable families to spend time together either through a short break or even daily outings.

Passionate about Parenting facilitated support for parents of young families.

Support for action against gender based violence, in particular raising awareness during the 16 Days of Activism against gender based violence.

Support for Indoor members through visiting, writing and a teleconferencing project. Emergency bags for those being admitted to hospital unexpectedly, knitting for premature babies, fiddle blankets and prayer shawls.

Support for families at prison visitor centres.

#### **Public benefit statement**

Mothers' Union Ireland had total reserves at 31 December 2016 of €477,844 (2015: €468,356).

# Independent examiner's report to the charity trustees of Mothers' Union in Ireland

### Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2016

#### **1** Principal accounting policies

#### Accounting convention

These financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis under the historical cost convention, as modified by the valuation of investments, and in accordance with Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) – (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102). The principal accounting policies are set out below.

#### **Functional currency**

The presentation currency of the financial statements is the Euro  $(\epsilon)$ .

#### **Incoming resources**

Incoming resources are received by way of donations and gifts and are included in full in the statement of financial activities upon receipt.

#### **Resources expended**

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to that category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with use of the resources. The three main activity categories are:

#### Charitable activities

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to supply them.

#### Governance costs

Governance costs include expenditure on administration of the charity and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements, and an appropriate apportionment of indirect costs.

#### **Unrestricted funds**

Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources received or generated which are expendable at the discretion of the charity in furtherance of its objectives

#### **Restricted funds**

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objectives of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes

#### 8 Movement in funds

#### Mums in May

Fundraising campaign inaugurated in 2012 to mark 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Mothers' Union in Ireland and continued triennially. Funds are raised for the work of Mothers' Union Worldwide; support of projects and the development of Mothers' Union in All-Ireland. It is administered by a sub-committee appointed by All-Ireland Trustees.

#### **Jubilee Keane**

These funds are specifically for the provision of office equipment and, should it be necessary, to fulfil any administrative obligations on the winding up of the organisation.

#### Conference

Funds set aside from members' subscriptions each year in order to provide a triennial residential training conference for diocesan officers.

#### Chapel

Funds provided by Dioceses towards expenses relating to the Mothers' Union Chapel at Christ Church Cathedral, otherwise known as the Laurence O'Toole Chapel.

#### Centenary

Funds raised by members and invested following the centenary celebrations of Mothers' Union in Ireland in 1987, invested through RCB and income generated used to support ordinands training for ministry in the Church of Ireland. The fund is administered by a sub committee appointed by All-Ireland Trustees and grants are awarded annually.

#### Action and Outreach/Overseas unit

Funds raised specifically for the work of Mothers' Union Overseas, sent directly to central Mothers' Union at Mary Sumner House who administer the funds and oversee the work carried out.

#### **Marketing Unit**

Funds used for the promotion of Mothers' Union to members and the wider community.
